The policy allows emerging critical needs funding for an organization for up to three years at a time. First 5 San Diego seeks opportunities to support programs where funding can be leveraged or matched, or where services can be sustained, therefore, maximizing our investment.	
	The request before the Commission is to approve Emerging Critical Needs funding for four programs: (1) Best Start at Sharp, (2) Cal-SAFE, (3) Maternity Shelter Program and (4) Reducing Childhood Injury and Death.
