2. Grant Acceptance and Contract Amendment

- Found that the proposed actions are consistent with the Commission's Strategic Plan, furthers the support and improvement of early childhood development within the County, and provides a public benefit.
- 2) Upon approval by the California Department of Education, accepted a Grant for up to \$211,066.
- 3) Increased funding for the <u>Quality Preschool Initiative</u> in the FY 2016-17 Operating Budget up to \$211,066 to a total not to exceed the amount of up to \$14,588,343.
- 4) Authorized the Executive Director, or her designee, to negotiate a project length budget and execute a contract amendment with the San Diego County Superintendent of Schools, contract # 542056, for up to \$211,066 for a total contract amount of up to \$14,588,343 for FY 2016-17.

3. Finance Committee Report

Fred Baranowski, Chairman of the Finance Committee, gave an update to the Commission on its financial status as of December 31, 2016 and the 2nd Quarter Budget Projection for FY 2016-17.

4. Executive Director Monthly Report

Assistant Executive Director Corral-Terrazas reported the following:

- 1) <u>Healthy Development Services</u> is a finalist in the Innovation Challenge 2.0. Let's Get Healthy California created the Innovation Challenge 2.0 as an opportunity to learn from and connect with community partners with the hope that unique innovations can be duplicated in other communities to make California the healthiest state in the nation. HDS was recognized for serving children with mild to moderate development and behavior concerns.
- 2) The <u>IMPACT Family Connections</u> effort with YMCA of San Diego was launched. It is off to a great start. They are creating a new childcare tool kit for the Home Visiting staff and parents across the County. They are focusing on the parents and helping them to choose high-quality childcare. This is expanding the reach of the program.
- 3) First 5 San Diego received notice from the Healthy Families of America that <u>First 5 First Steps</u> program is officially a multi-site accredited system; San Diego is the first County to receive a multi-site accreditation in the Country.
- 4) The <u>KidStart</u> program has been recognized as a program of excellence by Jackson Health Care as part of their 2016 hospital charitable service award program.
- 5) <u>Dashboard Review</u>: Everything is on track. The Oral Health Initiative is a little bit below target, but it will meet target by the end of the fiscal year. Healthy Developmental Services is also little behind, and it too will be caught up by the end of the year.
