Overview:

The Commission will be presented with the Annual Report of First 5 California for Fiscal Year 2015-16. The report is submitted in compliance with the Health and Safety Code Section 130140 (d) that requires local commissions to hold a Public Hearing to allow for public comment on the State Commission's Annual Report. The data from First 5 San Diego programs were compiled by local staff and accepted by the Commission in a public hearing on October 17, 2016 (Item 1) before submitting the data to the State First 5 Commission. These data are included in the aggregate numbers in this report.

Key State Annual Report findings are listed below:

- First 5 programs are reaching the most vulnerable and needy children and families in California.
- First 5 programs are providing children and families with services that are shown to promote school readiness, and thus are making wise investments in the future of California and its children and families.
- First 5 programs are improving children's health, development, and learning.
- First 5 programs' efforts to change systems of care are improving the accessibility, coordination, cultural competence, and quality of services for young children and their families.
