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| | Overview: The Childhood Injury Prevention Program has expanded and strengthened efforts in the County of San Diego to educate parents, caregivers and early care and education /childcare staff about childhood injury prevention strategies and arm them with the knowledge, resources and tools they need to make their homes, automobiles and communities safer for children 0 through 5. Funding will be used to provide education (ECE) staff about childhood injury prevention strategies to improve childhood safety for children. The services support the Commission's Strategic Plan Goals to: Promote each child's healthy physical, social and emotional development and; Strengthen each family's ability to provide nurturing, safe and stable environments. Since 2013 the program has, on average, provided injury prevention training to 925 parents and 170 providers at 50 ECE sites each fiscal year. | Executive Director Arguilez |

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| | Overview: First 5 San Diego proposes to extend the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Health and Human Services Agency's Public Health Services department to increase the number of infant and toddler childcare facilities that implement breastfeeding-friendly policies and provide lactation accommodation. Public Health Services has implemented similar workplace lactation accommodation support since Fiscal Year 2012-13. They have developed educational materials, sample policies, and training programs for businesses, including childcare providers through a MOU with First 5 San Diego and a Community Transformation Grant. Continuing to contract with Public Health Services for this work will provide continuity of services that have been in place for over three years, enhance efficiency by tapping into existing expertise, materials, and training programs rather than building them from scratch, and take advantage of the critical knowledge that Public Health Services has developed through experience and research in the area of increasing breastfeeding in workplaces and childcare facilities. | Executive Director Arguilez |
