

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>2 Public Hearing</b></p> <p><b>Presentation</b></p> <p><b>Action</b></p>	<p><b>Public Hearing on the Annual Audit for FY 2010-11</b> Comments limited to two minutes per speaker Supporting Document</p> <p><b>Overview:</b> The Health and Safety Code requires local commissions to conduct an annual, independent financial audit to provide the State and public with a detailed financial picture of the Commission. The Health and Safety Code also requires local commissions to hold a public hearing for these audits. The FY 2010-11 audit for First 5 San Diego was performed by the firm of Moss, Levy &amp; Hartzheim. The audit report concluded that there were no instances of non-compliance or other matters that are required to be reported, and they did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that they consider to be material weaknesses. The Finance Committee reviewed the draft audit report at its September 27, 2011 meeting.
