

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>2</b></p> <p><b>Public Hearing</b></p> <p><b>Action</b></p>	<p><b>Public Hearing: Annual Audit for FY 2015-16</b>  Comments limited to two minutes per speaker  Supporting Document</p> <p><b>Overview:</b>  The Health and Safety Code requires local commissions to conduct an annual, independent financial audit to provide the State and public with a detailed financial picture of the Commission’s fiscal activities.</p> <p>The Health and Safety Code requires local commissions to hold a public hearing on the audit. The FY 2015-16 audit for First 5 San Diego was performed by the firm of Christy White Associates. The audit report concluded that there were no instances of non-compliance or other matters that are required to be reported, and they did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that they consider to be material weaknesses.
