# **Updates Since Last Report**

## **Health**

- Healthy Development Services (HDS)
  - HDS Countywide Coordinator: American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP)
     The American Academy of Pediatrics is continuing to provide technical assistance to the HDS Regions on how to adjust and continue serving families during COVID-19.
  - AAP continues to provide quality assurance checks on HDS contractors and ensuring that providers have the needed skill sets to ensure effective service delivery.
  - Staff and Data and Evaluation Manager are working with partners AAP and Harder Co. to develop
    the caregiver well-being checkup process to screen for parent/caregiver mental health concerns. A
    referral process is also being developed. The screening and referrals for mental health will meet
    the Strat plan objective.

#### KidSTART

 Rady Children's Hospital is continuing to provide services to children 0-5 via a combination of virtual and in-person services.

#### Mi Escuelita

Staff is working with lead to develop the caregiver mental health screening and referral process to meet the new Strat plan objective for parent/caregiver mental health screening and referral. Additionally, Mi Escuelita is operating as per the guidance shared through the Covid-19 CDPH, CDSS and Early Care and Education Sector. The preschool is offering a combination of in person and virtual preschool services.

### • Oral Health Initiative (OHI)

 Health clinics are continuing to provide dental services to children 0-5 through a combination of telehealth and limited in-person routine dental services.

## <u>Learning</u>

#### Learn Well Initiative

 SDCOE provides professional development to Learn Well providers. An SDQPI Professional Development Course outlining the professional development opportunities available on the SDCOE and SDQPI Websites. This process is complex as the
application is completed through the Workforce Registry and SDCOE staff must ensure that the
qualifying information submitted is valid and correct.

## **Family**

- <u>First 5 First Steps (Home Visiting Initiative)</u>
  - All Contractors continue to deliver a combination of both telehome visiting and virtual connectiosn with families.
  - The new CalLearn HHSA Eligibility Operations contract has launched this year serving pregnant and parenting teens. Contractors have access to CalWIN which allows them to order supportive services payments for Cal Learn clients (diapers, childcare, etc).
  - The new CA Home visiting expansion effort has been verbally approved and formal notification is pending early February 2021. This contract will serve the Southbay region.
- First Steps Countywide Coordinator: American Academy of Pediatrics Chapter 3 (AAP CA-3)
  - Beginning work on Action Plan for F5CA Home Visiting Coordination grant, due February 19.

#### • Finance Committee

o The Finance Committee met on January 19, 2021 at which time the committee reviewed and approved the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter expenditure projections and Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2020.

#### • First 5 Networking / Administrative Updates / Professional Development

- Executive Director Arguilez worked with key partners, with AAP as co-lead, to submit a proposal for the new ACEs AWARE Network of Care grant on 12/21/20. First 5 SD would be the lead organization and the fiscal agent if awarded. The award announcement is pending as of this report completion and budget submitted was \$3million for a period of 18mos.
- Executive Director Arguilez continues to lead the ECE/Child Care Sector on behalf of the County Emergency Operations Center (EOC). This requires ongoing coordination with the various stakeholder groups externally and our internal EOC leadership team.
- Executive Director Arguilez continues to support the Child Care Disaster Council as the Co-chair and linking the Sector to the EOC to discuss the emergency response needs to the field including communications and access to supplies and distribution efforts with local stakeholders.
  - Current issue is supporting and advocating for childcare vaccine rollout and communications to ensure the community of providers are well informed.
- Executive Director Arguilez has hired two new staff as of December 2020: Agency Program and Evaluation Administrator, Lenette Javier and Fiscal Manager, Tina Bagsic.

# Background on First 5 San Diego Commission's Current Projects

#### 2-1-1 INFORMATION AND REFERRAL

2-1-1 San Diego is a free 24-hour phone service and online database that connects people with community resources. 2-1-1 also operates a First 5 San Diego Warm Line that assists parents of children ages zero through five with locating services and resources for their families.

### CHILDHOOD INJURY PREVENTION PROGRAM

The Childhood Injury Prevention Program educates parents, caregivers and early childhood education staff about childhood injury prevention strategies to make homes, automobiles and communities safer for children ages zero through five.

### **FIRST 5 FIRST STEPS**

First 5 First Steps (F5FS) provides countywide home visitation services to specific high-risk target populations including pregnant and parenting teens, military, refugee/immigrant and low-income families using the Healthy Families America (HFA) model and Baby TALK curriculum.

### **HEALTHY DEVELOPMENT SERVICES**

Healthy Development Services (HDS) is an array of services for early identification and treatment of children with mild to moderate developmental delays. Services include assessment and treatment for developmental concerns (including Speech and Language, Physical Therapy, and Occupational Therapy), behavioral concerns (parenting class, coaching and therapy) and Care Coordination to all families receiving HDS services.

### **KIDSTART**

KidSTART is an integrated program within First 5 San Diego and HHSA Behavioral Health Services to support children with complex needs. The KidSTART Center performs triage, assessment, referrals and treatment for children with multiple complex delays and disorders. The KidSTART Clinic provides comprehensive behavioral and social-emotional clinical treatment (First 5 San Diego funding supports the Center only).

#### KIT FOR NEW PARENTS

The Kit for New Parents is a free, comprehensive resource from First 5 California for new and expectant parents emphasizing the importance of a child's early years. Kits are distributed countywide and are available in English and Spanish.

#### MATERNITY HOUSING PROGRAM (MHP)

MHP assists these young women who are homeless, or at risk of becoming homeless, develop the skills necessary to live independently while providing a safe and stable home for themselves and their children.

### MI ESCUELITA THERAPEUTIC PRESCHOOL

Mi Escuelita provides a therapeutic preschool experience for young children who have been exposed to domestic violence and abuse.

#### **ORAL HEALTH INITIATIVE**

The Oral Health Initiative (OHI) provides oral health services, care coordination and preventative education to children ages birth through five with the goal of improving oral health and promoting positive oral health practices.

## **LEARN WELL INITIATIVE**

<u>Learn Well Initiative</u> aims to continue as a partner within the County-wide San Diego Quality Preschool Initiative (SDQPI) and build the early learning and care systems and supports providers need to serve families with children ages birth to 5 years of age.
