

The Strategic Plan framework provides an overview of the content and organization of the Strategic Plan. These provide the basis for the development and implementation of strategic initiatives, projects, programs and services. The first version of this framework was adopted in 2009 through in-depth community engagement, with revisions applied in recent years.

# Enhanced Community Engagement

- Partnerships with CBOs to provide outreach assistance (CBOs will receive \$1,000 stipend)

  - Black, Indigenous, Latino, Asian, and other People of Color (BIPOC) communities
  - Migrant communities
  - Refugee communities
  - Miliary families
  - LGBTQ+ families
  - Justice-involved families or formerly incarcerated parents
